A motorbike is **..not as/so expensive as a van is.**
6. The Mercedes was bigger than the Opel.  
The Opel wasn't **..as/so big as the Mercedes.**

**So + adjective + that = such (a) + adjective + noun + that**

1. The girl was so beautiful that everyone stared at her.  
She **was such a beautiful girl that everyone stared at her.**
2. It was such hot weather that I sat in the garden all the day.  
The weather **was so hot that I sat in the garden all the day.**
3. It was such a surprise that I didn't know what to say.  
I was **so suprising that I didn't know what to say.**
4. The box was so heavy that we couldn't lift it.  
It was **such a heavy box that we couldn't lift it.**
5. They were such naughty children that they were punished by the teacher.  
The children **were so naughty that they were punished by the teacher.**
6. The English language is so important that many people learn it every day.  
English is **such an important language that may people learn it every day.**
7. Sarah was such a young girl that her parents wouldn't leave her alone.  
Sarah was **so young that her parents wouldn't leave her alone.**
8. These people are so poor that they always need help.  
They are **such poor people that they always need help.**

**Sentence transformation with "too + enough"**

Examples: The soup is so hot. We can't eat it.  
This soup is **too hot** to eat.

TOO + ADJECTIVE

The boy is too short to climb the tree.  
The boy isn't **tall enough** to climb the tree.

ADJECTIVE + ENOUGH

1. Jared was lazy, he didn't pass the test.  
Jared didn't work hard **enough to pass the test.**
2. Alice is only 16. She's too young to get married.  
Alice isn't **old enough to get married.**
3. The cheese is so hard. We can't cut it.  
The cheese is **too hard to cut it.**  
The cheese isn't **soft enough to cut it.**
4. You're not old enough to have grandchildren.  
You're **too young to have grandchildren.**
5. The car is too slow to get to New York in three hours.  
The car isn't **fast enough to get to New York in tree hours.**
